1. Re-read 2 Cor 2:15, 16 – what are the implications of this verse for you? Also discuss the main 'learnings' from this series, and how we can become grace dispensers.

2. The Apostle Paul asks, "and who is equal to such a task". What is this referencing and what is at stake in this weighty question?

3. Tips to engage with the lost from a chaplain: "I enter a room, whether I've been invited or not, believing that God is already present in that place. I picture God pouring from his pitcher into me, so that now I am now ready to pour into others. I enter with a smile, feeling privileged to share the sacred ground on which someone is clinging to life. If I forget that God goes ahead of me, I start to think that I am bringing God into the room, which gives me an air of smugness. I feel pressure to say the right thing, to impress, I take myself too seriously. I need the constant reminder that God goes before me. I can't wait to hear the story of the person in the bed. I wonder what I will learn. I picture a role reversal. I put myself in their shoes, I put myself in the bed. What would it be like for a Christian to walk into my life at these final moments of mine. It causes me to smile more, a last chance for grace, a last chance for love." Discuss and translate this into your own efforts to reach the lost.

4. Who are you inviting to Easter. Pray for the Easter service to impact those without Christ.
