2. In what ways do you see “scientism” — the belief that only science can tell us what’s true — shaping the way people think about God, faith, or morality?
3. Psalm 8 says that God made human beings “a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honor.” How does that truth challenge the idea that humanity is merely a product of chance or insignificance?
4. What do you make of C.S. Lewis’s idea that our hunger for meaning and wonder points to the reality that we were “made for another world”? How have you personally experienced that kind of longing?
5. How does knowing that “all things were created through him and for him” (Colossians 1:16) change the way you think about science, creation, and your own purpose in God’s world?
