1. What part of this message stood out to you the most and why do you think it grabbed your attention?
2. Read 1 Corinthians 15:3–8 together. Why do you think Paul emphasizes eyewitnesses and historical details so strongly in this passage? How does this affect the way you view the resurrection?
3. Which of the common explanations for the resurrection (Jesus didn't really die, the body was stolen, hallucinations, legend over time) do you find most compelling or hardest to dismiss? Why?
4. The message said, "If Jesus really rose from the dead, it changes everything." What is one area of your life that would look different if you truly lived with the resurrection in mind; your fears, habits, relationships, or hopes for the future?
5. Throughout this series, "Beyond a Reasonable Doubt," we've explored hard questions and foundational beliefs. Which topic or message in this series strengthened your faith the most or challenged you the most? How has this series shaped the way you think about God, faith, or doubt?
