

REVELATION – wk.11 | GROUP CONTENT

SERMON QUESTIONS:

1. **Contrasts** – The message contrasts two ultimate realities, a state of blessedness and a state of condemnation. As you reflect on that, what stands out to you most and why?
2. **Character of Christ** – The image of being marked with the name of Jesus points to a mind and life shaped by Him. What would it look like for your thoughts, attitudes, and inner life to more fully reflect the character of Christ?
3. **Eternal Thinking** – The sermon described the first five minutes after death as a powerful way to think about eternity. How does that perspective challenge or reshape the way you are living right now?
4. **Shared Faith** – Revelation shows that God is not eager for judgment but is proclaiming the eternal Gospel to every nation, tribe, language, and people. How does that shape your understanding of God's heart and your own urgency or responsibility in sharing your faith?
5. **True Rest** – The idea of “no rest” and “no relief” paints a sobering picture of separation from God. In contrast, what does true rest in Christ look like in your life right now, and how can you lean more fully into it this week?

“I Will” STATEMENT: An ‘I Will’ Statement is where we respond to what we discussed by making a simple commitment to an action we can complete in the next week. It is a deliberate commitment to practically obey the Word of God and listen to the Holy Spirit. Share what you feel like God may be calling you to do.

PRAYER: Take time to ask each person how the group can be praying for them during the next week. Take notes so you can follow up. If this is your first meeting, plan to be the one to pray out loud for the group. As the group continues, pay attention to everyone's comfort level with praying out loud before inviting others to do so. No one should feel pressured, but should be encouraged.
