

FUTURES & FOUNDATIONS – wk.2 | GROUP CONTENT

SERMON QUESTIONS:

1. **Casual Faith** – The message contrasted a casual faith with Paul's desire to be "ALL IN" for Christ. Where are you most tempted to become casual in your relationship with God or your participation in His mission?
2. **God's, Not Mine** – "Everything I have is entrusted, nothing I have is owned." What is hardest for you to think of as belonging to God rather than belonging to you? Your time, money, home, abilities, relationships, influence, or something else?
3. **Faithful Stewardship** – Esau treated something sacred as though it had little value because he wanted something immediate. Is there anything God has entrusted to you that you may be treating too casually? What would faithful stewardship of it look like?
4. **Hands In** – Futures & Foundations calls us to make disciples, plant churches, invest in the next generation, send missionaries, and serve our communities. Where do you believe God is asking you to personally put your hands to this vision rather than simply believing in it?
5. **What Is Your Step?** – The message offered three possible steps: start, become intentional, or expand. As you consider your serving, generosity, prayer, discipleship, and support of Futures & Foundations, which step is God asking you to take, and what will you do about it?

"I Will" STATEMENT: An 'I Will' Statement is where we respond to what we discussed by making a simple commitment to an action we can complete in the next week. It is a deliberate commitment to practically obey the Word of God and listen to the Holy Spirit. Share what you feel like God may be calling you to do.

PRAYER: Take time to ask each person how the group can be praying for them during the next week. Take notes so you can follow up. If this is your first meeting, plan to be the one to pray out loud for the group. As the group continues, pay attention to everyone's comfort level with praying out loud before inviting others to do so. No one should feel pressured, but should be encouraged.
